PRAYING FOR OUR FELLOW BPCIS CHURCHES: HERALD B-P CHURCH

- * Pray for our outreach in the neighbourhoods. We started giving out gifts to the residents on Festivals since last Christmas. One of the residents said that she hopes to go to Church when the pandemic situation improves.
- * Herald Session is looking for a new Pastor, an Elder to rise among the leaders and an Assistant to the Pastor as **Rev Bob Phee** is planning for retirement in a couple of years.

FOREIGN MISSIONS – Bhutan

- * The country has a population of 770,000 of which more than 85% practise Buddhism. The rest are Hindus and a small percentage are Christians. Pray to God to raise up evangelists and church planters to evangelise and establish churches. Pray also for resources and manpower required to deliver good Biblical and leadership training for the believers.
- * Like most countries, Bhutan faces tremendous challenges due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Tourism is badly affected. Consequently, many lost their jobs and income. Pray for the authorities to have an effective and safe strategy to lift travel restrictions soon.

- * This ministry is led by **Aaron Sewang**. He ministers in Thimpu, Wangdue, Began and Tsirang together with lay leaders. May the Lord grant him grace, spiritual wisdom, and guidance as he shepherds the 4 congregations.

Pray for sustainable blood counts and the side effects of the 6th cycle of chemotherapy to be abated; the family to always be grateful for God's providences and faithfulness, and magnify His Name as the treatment awaits its end next month.

- * Remember **Joseph Ng** in prayer (son of **Philip and Nancy Ng – ZMS**): Thank God **Joseph** has completed his first chemotherapy cycle on 20 September, and is now recuperating. Thank God there is no issue of concern. The doctor has short-listed around 7 donors internationally for bone marrow transplant. They have started the bone marrow transplant procedure, which should include contacting the best match in the list. Pray for God's mercy that he is willing to come forward, and that the transplant process will go through smoothly, and that **Joseph** may be allowed to go home for a week before the second chemotherapy starts. Pray that he will rest well and be strengthened to go for the second chemo session.
