SHARING By Rebecca Lee

Missionary to Cambodia

Reading Ezra and Nehemiah is somewhat like getting to know 'twins' who are similar but not the same, 2 men who shared the goal of seeing Jerusalem rebuilt, and went about it differently because of their personalities, gifts and life circumstances. The similarity lies in how both men saw clearly that it was "God's gracious hand" (Ezra 7:10, Neh 2:18) that worked things out for them as they took one step after another into a very unknown situation.

Today, I'd like to share about 5 Cambodian believers who are very different, but as we read their stories, they reveal God's gracious hand in leading and shaping them from past to present. The 5 of them are staff workers at SONOKO, a movement reaching out to university students in both public and private campuses. I'm on the board of SONOKO as the representative from OMF – it was a ministry started by OMF missionaries and still sits under the OMF umbrella. Over these 3 years, it has been a challenge and a privilege to serve in this way.

PHEARAK POV, GENERAL SECRETARY (DIRECTOR) - God's hand lifted his head to look up and out

I first got to know Phearak as a shy 19-year-old who hardly dared to lift his head to speak to any older person, especially missionaries. For a long time he was the shadow of another more dynamic student leader and his very good friend. Then that young man, slated to be the first Cambodian General Secretary, died unexpectedly. Phearak never expected to become the General Secretary in Nov 2020 – he was more or less prompted and given a shove in that direction, I felt.

I wish that I could say, after one year, that Phearak is flourishing and exercising full leadership. He's not (yet). But his gentleness and humility continue to shine, and so does his love for Jesus. As SONOKO becomes more 'Khmer' and locally led, it has surfaced a problem of pride: one staff finds it hard to submit

to his leadership as they had been working as peers before. He'd sometimes pour out his frustrations to me but when I asked, "What can I or the Board do – should we speak to the staff?" he'd tell me to hold back and say, "Let me try again."

Here are his prayer requests:

- for strength, wisdom, and to be faithful and strong in the using my gifts to serve God.
- to focus on God's word and have time to reflect my journey with God and listen to Him.
- for my family to live in peace through Jesus Christ. May God protect them in every sickness.

SOPHEAR SOUN, PHNOM PENH BRANCH LEADER - God's hand arranged her romance

Sophear got married at the beginning of this year. Her husband is quite a few years younger; he joined the student ministry when he was still studying; she never discipled him directly, but was 'bong' (older sister) to him, as with everyone else because of her maturity in age and experience. Then, as he saw her good heart and love for God, different feelings grew. She had not dared to think of him in a romantic way but his persistence and sincerity won her over. They waited for quite a few years to marry, as he had to graduate and then get a job. Now she is pregnant and looking forward, albeit anxiously, to being a mother.

Here are her prayer requests:

- The baby will grow well; and safety for my husband as he travels to a few different provinces for work.
- Continue to grow in faith and trust in the Lord.

SINA KHOUN, SIEM REAP BRANCH LEADER – God's strong and protective hand over her life.

Sina comes from a very poor family, which delayed her general education. Her journey of faith met with opposition from the family in the initial years. Last year, an older sister died of cancer very quickly after the diagnosis, leaving a

devastated husband and 3 children behind – thankfully she had trusted in the Lord Jesus before she died. Not long after making a video about SONOKO (see link below) in early November, Sina got infected with COVID-19; her recovery was slow, and then her stomach acted up, again, and she landed in hospital for that. Thankfully she has since returned home and has jumped back into ministry.

Here are her prayer requests:

- for my family to meet Jesus and believe in Him with all their heart and seek Him more and more.
- for me to be close with Jesus daily, be humble and have an open heart to understand others, and growing to think like Jesus.
- for wisdom to make plans and strategies to serve and disciple students.

DOEUN LAI, PHNOM PENH STAFF - God's hand on a tribal boy and a farmer's son

Lai is unique in physique and ethnicity. For he is not Khmer, but from a tribal group called Kuy in Preah Vihear province and has those distinctive features of high cheekbones and strong jaws.

Young though he is, he's already lent his voice for recordings of books of the Bible being translated into Kuy – his family are believers and they know God's help in their problems. A farmer's son, he had not visited his family since December 2020 and asked for prayers to be able to make that trip. In God's timing, he was able to visit them in October this year.

Here are his prayer requests:

- Praise for opportunities to study bible online classes and to take a short course with a Bible school.
- For me to grow more on how to work with students and staff, be humble and love each other.
- For my relationship with God daily to have more experiences with prayer and reading the Bible and worship.
- For me to grow how to make plans and write better reports and understand how to develop and improve myself and ministry.

CHENDA SOUS, SIEM REAP INTERN, also a 4th year university student – God's gracious hand in arranging circumstances that led her to turn to Him whom she used to hate.

"When I did not believe in Jesus, I hated Jesus so much. When my friends told me about Jesus, I was always angry with them. When I was young, my parents argued fiercely with each other... I sat up and looked up to the sky and asked if there is a God in the world... Then my younger sister and I were invited to learn English. The teacher taught us English about a year, and then he started to share the gospel to us. He also invited me and my sister to his church. A year later, we came to believe in Jesus and accepted Him as our Savior. Thank God He changed my life, despite all the difficulties. In 2014, my sister and I got to know SONOKO where I learnt to study the Bible and lead a small group in studying the Word. I always receive encouragement and love from my fellow students and staff."

Here are her prayer requests:

- for my family, that they may believe in Jesus.
- for my life to glorify Him.
- for Him to fill my shortcomings in serving Him. May God help me be faithful and humble heart in all circumstances.

Has God's hand been apparent this year for SONOKO – when students disappeared from Phnom Penh or Siem Reap as universities closed; when many returned to remote places that had limited access to modern amenities and the internet; when ideas kept melting away into nothing as online attendance kept dropping? This video https://www.youtube.com/watch? v=OJwsm7OKzcA gives a glimpse of what SONOKO went through this year. Trace the hope they have through what is shared and I believe you will join them in speaking confidently of God's gracious hand and provision for SONOKO through 2021.
