

Dear brethren, I thank God and the Session for giving me two months of Sabbatical from the 15 July to the 15 September. I thank the pastoral team, and other leaders, for standing in the gap during my absence. I also thank many of you for your support in prayers, encouragement and other diverse ways. Lastly, I thank God that my three children had the opportunity to practise independence. I am deeply grateful.

What did I profit in this Sabbatical?

First, the two Summer courses (Christianity and Politics & Reading & Preaching Biblical Poetry) I attended gave me some good insights and enriched my knowledge. I found the courses at Regent College to be very academic and geared more towards the Western mindset. However, the diverse nationalities of students helped me to apply principles in similar and relevant contexts.

Secondly, God's providence. God guided many people to us during this journey. God graciously opened many doors for me to share my testimony of His Almighty power in transforming my life. I was invited to preach for the main service and share my story in Edmonton Christian Missionary Alliance (CMA) Church. We drove 13 hours from Vancouver to Edmonton. It was a bonus/reward from God for us to witness His majestic creations as we stopped at certain places to enjoy the marvelous scenic sites, such as the sparkling blue lakes and the Rockies, majestic mountains, waterfalls, running streams, fields, cattle feeding on the grass etc.

Romans 1:20 "For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse."

Indeed, my heart is filled with the awesomeness of God. During our stay in Edmonton, the couple brought many of their friends to meet me and asked me to share my testimony and God's Word to encourage them.

Third, God's providential care and guidance continued in Dallas, Texas. We were hosted by another lovely couple, Ross and Boye - Linh's long-time church friends. We were able to catch up with many old friends, and meet many new friends too. In our fellowship we shared about our challenges, struggles, trials, joy and especially God's grace and His ever faithfulness in our lives. As the weather was very hot, we spent most of the time in the house. The couple and Linh made arrangement to gather all their old friends from Florida, Louisiana and meet at Atlanta, Georgia. Again, we drove about a thousand miles, 13 hours from Dallas, Texas. We spent four days there. Repeatedly, reuniting with old friends whilst making new friends. It was truly a meaningful time as our meetings were often filled with thanksgiving, glory and honour to the Lord.

Fourth, by God's divine appointment, I was able to share the Gospel with Emerson, boyfriend of our hosts' daughter, Grace. Emerson is a Korean, born and raised in the US. He is in his final semester of University while Grace has another year. He asked me for my view and advice about something that is troubling him a lot. His good friend was in jail for manslaughter, seeking his forgiveness for committing murder against their other friend. I shared with him about God forgiving our sins. I encouraged him to forgive his friend. I asked him to be merciful and ask God to give him the enabling to forgive his friend. I even asked him to visit his friend in prison, among other things I shared with him.

One day I crafted a sinner's confession and emailed to him.

PS: Dear Emerson, by God's grace I was able to share the Gospel, Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ with you. If you are willing to confess that you are a sinner, Emerson, you can pray this prayer on your own:

"Dear Creator God, Maker of heaven and earth and everything therein, I, Emerson thank you for showing me Who You are through

the sharing of your people in the church and individuals. Thank you for helping me to believe the Bible is truth and Jesus Christ is the Son of God that came into this world to die on the cross for my sins.

I acknowledge that I am a sinner. I confess and repent and pray that you will forgive all my sins and cleanse me with your precious blood. I, Emerson believe and accept Jesus as my personal Saviour and Lord, in Jesus' name I pray, amen."

I pray that you will continue to seek the truth. Go to church, read and study the Bible. "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you."
