

FY 2022 INCOME & EXPENDITURE (UNAUDITED) AND FY 2023 BUDGET UPDATE

Praise our generous God for His providence in 2022. Despite the uncertain recovery from the pandemic, the Lord faithfully provided for all our needs, so much so that we were able to bless the neighbouring communities beyond Zion's walls as we commit to "Loving Beyond Boundaries".

In FY 2022 our total Offering and Miscellaneous Income collected amounted to \$1,583,311, a slight increase of 5% from FY 2021. I thank all of you for your committed support toward the kingdom work at Zion Serangoon as this would keep us abreast of the average headline inflation rate year over year of 6.1% for 2022.

As we gradually resumed usual operations post-covid in 2022, a part of the unutilised expenses budgeted for came from step downs in pre-event testing cost (ART kits) & regular disinfection. Of the full budget 2022, only 68.5% was spent as the bulk of the budgeted repairs have been postponed to 2023 pending further discussions with Faith BPC. Thankfully, utility costs have also stabilized through 2022 and the large increase we had budgeted for had not been utilized. The 2 areas that accounted for the bulk of total expenditure were as usual staff expenses and foreign mission expenses.

For 2023, the Combined Session and Board of Deacons have approved an operating expense budget of \$ 1,991,832. This reflects a marginal increase (1.3%) in budget compared to Budget 2022 as the bulk of repair and maintenance works budgeted for 2022 have been postponed to 2023. The significant variances against Budget 2022 expenses are as follows:

FY 2022 INCOME & EXPENDITURE (UNAUDITED) AND FY 2023 BUDGET UPDATE

- » Budget 2023 Church Office budget sees a marginal 2.5% drop over Budget 2022. This is due to the postponement of 2022 planned repairs to 2023 being largely unchanged and some movement within the Church staff team (Ps Yap's retirement & projected new ministry staff requirements). On top of the above mentioned reasons of postponed works, the large variance of \$442,856 or 42% of Budget 2023 over 2022 actual (unaudited) also includes unutilised budget for ministry internship & medical benefits provisions.
- Worship Cluster which sees an increase of \$19,796 in budget mainly due to increased cost from fellowship tea expenditure with the full resumption of fellowship tea and increase in food prices concurrently.
- » Children's Ministry Cluster sees little variance in budget, seeing some cost savings as no Children's camp is planned for 2023.
- » Discipleship Cluster which sees an increase of \$20,918 in budget mainly due to event cost for a Covenant Bible School teaching conference planned for 2023. On top of that, the newly started Parenting ministry is also planning for a series of talks and workshops in the later part of the year, leading to corresponding rise in budget request.
- » Fellowship Cluster expenditure is projected to increase marginally across Senior Adults, Youth and International Fellowships. New programs are planned for combined YF with BPCIS churches, resumption of LKH devotions by SAF and Anniversary & Christmas Celebration for IF in 2023.
- The Mission Cluster will be undergoing restructuring as we align to the new church vision. In terms of HOME missions, the overall cost is expected to remain constant. For Foreign missions, following a strategic review, we will discontinue our ministries in Bangladesh, Myanmar, Vietnam, Bhutan and dive deeper partnerships in Cambodia and Philippines. This rebalance of portfolio will inevitably reduce Foreign Missions spending in the short term. However, we will also focus efforts into increase of whole of church missiology education that translates into deeper discipleship. God willing this translates into zeal for Home mission efforts and more foreign mission trips in the near future. One mission trip to Philippines has been planned in 2023.

FY 2022 INCOME & EXPENDITURE (UNAUDITED) AND FY 2023 BUDGET UPDATE

» Apart from the operating expenses budgeted above, we have also budgeted \$435,834 of Capital Expenditure (Capex) in 2023 under the Stewardship Cluster. Comparatively, this is \$ 187,834 more than budgeted for in 2022. The bulk of planned upgrade and improvements works from 2022 are still undergoing discussions with Faith BPC. On top of what was planned for since 2022, there is additional request for the overhaul of the AV system at \$66,667 (ZS share), new furniture & fittings, further toilet upgrades, church sign board and kitchen improvement. This brings our total projected expenditure for the coming FY 2023 to \$2,427,666.

A fuller presentation of FY 2022 Income and Expenditure Statement and Budget 2023 will be made at ACM 2023. The summaries of the unaudited FY 2022 Income and Expenditure and Budget 2023 expenses are presented below:
