Book Circle

In the Teochew dialect, Kia Toe Di (踏土地) means to walk in direct contact with the soil, barefooted. This was what my mother used to tell me when I was a schoolboy in the late 1950s. She said that that way I will be in contact with mother earth, with nature, and is beneficial to my health. This memory comes back to me when I read A W Tozer's observation about present-day civilization and our society. He said: "I consider it a sad and lamentable fact that men and women generally today are like zoo lions born in captivity. They are born in hospitals, walk on concrete sidewalks, breathe a lot of foul air, and are finally taken... to die. They never really get a chance to get their feet into the soil. ... How rarely do we ...feel the impulses of nature communicated to our beings...." What was Tozer referring to? He was lamenting that we have lost the capacity to wonder, in particular, at the world that God has created, and are unable to experience the impartation of the Holy Spirit in worshiping God. Tozer had strong convictions about the subject of worship as well as its being adversely affected by the invasion of "entertainment and theatre" into church worship. He reminds his readers that the primary purpose of God in creation is to prepare men and women to worship Him. Hence worship, and proper worship is the priority for Christians. He has written many books on this theme. We can start with the book 'Whatever Happened to Worship' by Tozer. It is a call to worship God in Spirit and in Truth. "God is a spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth" (John 4:19-24)

Since returning from my recent tour of Israel and Jordan (some 11 Zion BP members were on this tour) I have been researching books that meditate on worshiping God (a theme in our bible study during the tour). Tozer's writing is a good place to do so, though he had certain controversial views especially his stand against entertainment in churches. Go read his book and meditate on the matter and test his ideas against scripture's teaching. More on this subject, and on holiness, later.

There was something different in the air! And this was not due to the smell of barbeque (BBQ) food being cooked downstairs! In a sense, the atmosphere reflected the sweet fellowship that was going on.

On the evening of 1 April, 2023, the different generations of our church gathered to have a time of prayer and worship the LORD in song for the **Intergenerational (Intergen) Prayer and Praise** programme.

Through this collaboration between the Intergen Focus Area, Worship Cluster and the Prayer Fellowship, this event was organised for a threefold reason; to foster a closer connection between the different generations, to grow spiritually through corporate prayer,



and to promote the singing culture of our church.

With about 90 people in attendance, those present divided themselves into groups consisting of both younger and older believers. Towards the end of the structured Prayer and Praise segment, the different age groups then had the opportunity to share specific worship songs and hymns to sing together. It was encouraging to hear worship songs from different eras, yet all still praising the same LORD God!

At dinnertime, the worshippers gathered in the fellowship hall for a meal together. Again, it was heartening to see different age groups sharing a table together. We are also thankful for the willing chefs who prepared both the catered and BBQ food for us.

Overall, the thunderstorm happening outside did not dampen the spirit of unity among those present. It also did not matter that the individuals present were from different backgrounds, ages or nationalities. What mattered most was that our Lord Jesus had broken down every barrier to unite us in Him as His Body (Rom 12; 1 Cor 12; Eph 4:4-6).
