




BOOK REVIEW FROM BOOK CIRCLE



A Heart Ablaze: Igniting a Passion for God by John Bevere

This book is geared to American society but provides lessons that we can also glean. A repeated point made in the book is that falsehoods can (especially over time) become truth.



Bevere cites 2 Timothy 4:3-4 "For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to SUIT THEIR PASSIONS and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths". The reason for this is simple: we say we acknowledge God, but we do not truly desire to know Him. Bevere uses a clever term to describe this state of affairs: God is a "manageable diety". To illustrate his point, the author explicates the events around Moses, Aaron, and the people of Israel.

Read the book for details but briefly, Moses sought God in his heart while also fearing God for who He is. In contrast, Aaron and the people who followed Moses out of Egypt were expedient in their belief. Yes, worship God because He freed us from bondage in Egypt but it's a bother to have physical discomforts like lack of water and food. What does this say about Christians? Are they a sub-culture with distinctive features such as "born again" and "saved" but still in actions, deeds and values still are very much the current society. Or are they a counterculture like the early church where they sought after God and consecrated themselves (set apart) such that they were in the world but not of it.

"Grace" is a pivotal word in our Christian faith and Bevere dares to say that many Christians receive grace in vain. The spilt blood of Christ covers our sins and empowers us to live a life of obedience (with the help of the Holy Spirit) but oftentimes, Bevere asserts that this is head knowledge only and not of the heart. Do we truly desire to conform to God or do our desires get the better of us and we regress to the ways of the world while professing an INTENTION to obey God.

In a situation of wealth (current Singapore), religious freedom to worship is a heavy responsibility. For those who do not have this, there are enough evidence of persecution to daunt us and hopefully move us out of our

comfort zone. Isaiah 48:10-11 "Behold, I have refined you, but not assilver; I have tried you in the furnace of affliction. For my own sake, I do it, for how should my name be profaned? My glory I will not give to another". Bevere is prescriptive throughout the book (something I am not overly keen about) but a discerning reader can harvest the gems that are useful:

- a. What values are in current society today?
- b. How do Christians look at God? Do we fear Him like Moses (Exodus) or John (Revelation)?
- c. Do we need purification so as to lead to a reformation of ourselves?
- d. What are the outcomes of our assertions of our faith? The key points of the book of James are discussed here.

My final assessment of the book is that it attempts to guide you in your personal journey to know God. If anything, I would say that Bevere asks us to be honest in our hearts as we approach our Almighty in our daily walk with Him.

This book is available in the Book Circle. Drop by the Book Circle, a 24/7 "Word Ministry", situated at L1 Glass-Enclosed Lift Lobby to browse, pick up a book, read, and pass it on.
