Reflections...

Reflection: Jesus' words in Mark 9:42-50 are unadulterated and unsettling. He speaks of radical measures to deal with sin: cutting off hands, feet, and plucking out eyes. These are not literal commands, but a call to radical spiritual warfare.

Challenge: What areas of your life need radical spiritual warfare? What sins do you need to confront and eliminate? Are you willing to take drastic measures to follow Jesus and live a life of obedience to Him?

Praying for the World - Nepal

Currently, Nepal is in deep crisis. At least 21 people have been killed and hundreds injured as police opened fire on largely Gen-Z youth protesters. The protests began after the government banned 26 social media platforms (including Facebook, WhatsApp, YouTube, and X), claiming they spread unrest. The authorities have been very strict, but this has only fueled anger and pain among the young generation.

- » Healing for the wounded and traumatized
- » Peace in Nepal, that violence would not escalate further
- » Wisdom for government leaders to listen with humility and justice
- » Protection and guidance for the young generation to pursue change with peace



Report Jan to Jun 2025

Completion of Research Project at OCMS

After Home Assignment (HA, Apr to Nov 2023), I applied for Administrative Leave of Absence from OMF with the approval of ZS. ZS kindly supported me in different ways as I embarked in March 2024 on a program at Oxford Centre for Mission Studies, UK as a means to reflect and review the past 20 years or so on the field. I learnt to understand and do basic research and on 1 March 2025, submitted a 45-page paper entitled "5 loaves and 2 fish: An offering from 13 Singapore missionaries", exploring how the culture and values of Singaporean missionaries impact the way the gospel is shared to other cultures. I received a simple certificate of completion and am grateful for the whole challenging process of research and realise that it will be helpful as I teach at Discipleship Training Centre (see 2 paragraphs down).

The loss of Wan Jee

On 8 Mar 2025, at Wan Jee's deathbed, Siah Chuan asked me to be the link person between OMF Singapore and ZS in the matters relating to the wake and funeral details. It was one of the hardest thing I've ever done, and can only thank God for His grace and enabling. I am ever grateful that, together with Chris Tan, we formed the think-tank – it allowed me to get to know these 2 very special fieldworkers and to find support that all returnees need. I believe we are just now beginning to see some fruit, coming out from their emphasis and Wan Jee's reminder to pray and pray. Her loss is great.

Discipleship Training Centre (DTC)

In Mar 2023, before I headed back to Singapore for HA, the Dean of Discipleship Training Centre approached me to consider a role at DTC. Alvin Tan was formerly an OMFer serving in Cambodia with his family. Then, although everything was topsy turvy as I packed and sorted, I was struck immediately with a sense of excitement and the possibilities at the school, even though I questioned my qualifications and what the role demanded. Alvin did not pressure me to give an immediate reply. Slowly I asked questions of those connected to DTC, in particular Jenny Fung as DTC Board member, who helped me see that I was in a place to contribute to the school with my field experience and as a female.

It was only in Jun 2024, when I was at a 3-week-long retreat that catered specifically for missionaries, that God gave me the freedom to close the door on Cambodia. That also meant I could start exploring DTC in earnest. I had returned

to Singapore with the sense that I should live with and be the main caregiver for my mother, who was living on her own then. Providentially, my brother and his family said they would move in with her, which then freed me to consider DTC. Nonetheless, it remained a matter of prayer for some months, set aside as I worked on the project and also as I got involved in various ZS ministries.

The new academic year begins on 15 July and I will teach one course per term (4 altogether). Since end April, I have been helping a few students to build up their proficiency in English. There are 9 new ones altogether from Cambodia, China, Indonesia, Japan, the Philippines, Thailand and Timor Lester.

6 ways of getting involved in missions at ZS

Never had I imagined that ZS would embark on a direction for the church to see "Every Gardener a missionary". Nonetheless, a shortness of imagination can't but leave room for man to marvel at God's purposes. The Children Ministries approached me to run some programs for them and as I was convicted that it would need to be more a series than a mere one-off, they accommodated me and I believe now the children and the teachers have a clearer grasp of their place in God's mission. This year, the most rewarding thing was to see the teachers themselves and former short-term team members passing on the vision and lessons learnt. Last year's best equipping sessions happened when the FMC and I reviewed past practices and in the light of current trends in the world impacting the church's mission, we also found some ways forward – not all realised, but it was part of the learning process.

It was immensely important to Wan Jee and I that the short-term teams be equipped for what they would do in Cambodia and the Philippines – with a Biblical understanding of mission and crossing cultures. I led some of the sessions with her and I believe they are bearing fruit. In July, I facilitated one session for DG leaders on the 6 ways; and am prepared for a 2nd session to reach other leaders of ministries. Eventually, I want to see the whole church grow in understanding of *Missio Dei* as well, and actively applying the 6 ways as families, Fellowships and Discipleship Groups.

OMF Singapore on the move

Post-Covid, staff at OMF Singapore have noticed a surge of interest in missions to our surrounding nations, including Cambodia. Praise God! The Memorandum of Understanding between DTC and OMF allows me to help support this interest in various ways.

*In February at an event organised by OMF Singapore, I was on a panel of 3 to introduce the range of ministries in OMF Cambodia. The other countries were China and Thailand.

*In mid-June I ran 2 sessions of learning Khmer with a very capable Khmer student from DTC. There were 22 attendees for the first one, representing at least 3 churches and individuals.

*On July 30, I will share on Cambodia at OMF and plan to involve more Khmer students and missionaries with active involvement there.

*Between Oct 17 to 20, I will bring a team of up to 6 persons to Cambodia to do prayer walks and cultural exploration, to open the way for interested individuals. Ideally, such a trip should be administered by the team in OMF Cambodia but they are short-handed and the Field Director of Cambodia has agreed that I could be of help. Of course I have also cleared this trip with DTC.

Other matters

- a) I continue to enjoy the privilege of wheeling ZS members from Cheshire Home and also plan to keep up with the Block 123 visits as well.
- b) I have been studying Scripture (Precept upon Precept) with missionary friends online, and am also in a prayer trio meeting online once a month.
- c) I have had opportunities to encourage and make spiritual input into the lives of young ones at ZS (and elsewhere) and am grateful for their openness and for a few, an eagerness to grow in Him.

Thank you for your patience as you read this longer than usual report, as it is my first one after returning from Cambodia. Thank you too for your prayers for the events between July to October. And thank God for each of you in this committee – I believe God has put us, each with unique personality, perspectives and gifts to serve together at a time like this.
