WEEKLY PRAYER GUIDE

Persecution of Christians in China

Recent reports indicate that Chinese authorities have intensified their efforts against independent house churches, moving directly to the arrest of leaders and monitoring private communications. This shift marks an end to previous “grace periods” of warnings and fines, placing immense pressure on congregations to either join state-controlled religious bodies or face criminal prosecution. - » Pray that the Chinese church remains convicted that Christ alone is the Head of the Church, refusing to compromise biblical worship for state approval.
- » Pray for pastors, elders and church leaders facing digital surveillance and the threat of immediate imprisonment. Ask for the LORD’s sustaining grace, discernment and wisdom for these shepherds as they navigate intensifying state pressure.
- » Pray that the Holy Spirit would refine the church through these trials and cause the Gospel to flourish. May the Lord sovereignly protect His people and turn the hearts of their persecutors toward the truth of Christ.

- » We thank God for the International Fellowship’s 12th anniversary yesterday!

Worship Equipping Retreat

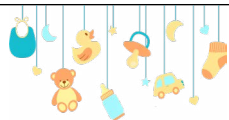

BLK 123 UPDATES: LOOKING BACK AT 2025

MINISTRY OVERVIEW

The Blk 123 Ministry continued its work in 2025, building upon foundations laid over the past four to five years. The ministry remains committed to caring for residents in the community, many of whom face challenges such as poverty, loneliness, illness, and uncertainty while faithfully bearing witness to the hope found in Jesus Christ.

MINISTRY GOALS FOR 2025

- » Care for existing families and build relationships with new residents.
- » Connect residents with churches for regular Sunday worship.
- » Establish Bible study and discipleship groups.
- » Develop a resident care network to encourage mutual support and outreach.
- » Work toward a local Sunday worship gathering point.
- » Collaborate with partners (including The AWWA Home @ Level 2 & 3) to expand care and outreach.

KEY DEVELOPMENTS AND ACTIVITIES (2025)

1. Leadership Transition and Renewed Engagement (April)

In April 2025, I (Rev. Eric Tay) joined the ministry as chaplain, marking a new chapter focused on presence and relationship building. Through regular visits and conversations, trust was gradually established with residents. While some were initially hesitant to engage in gospel conversations, patient and sincere interactions opened doors for meaningful dialogue and spiritual sowing.

Church members were encouraged to partner through prayer, participation in visits and care, and offering practical skills that could strengthen ongoing community support.

2. Expansion into AWWA Community Home (June)

In June 2025, the church was officially granted the opportunity to conduct activities at the AWWA Community Home at Blk 123. This opened a new ministry doorway to engage not only residents but also more than twenty full-time staff, including administrative personnel and nurses.

Weekly sessions began on 10 June 2025 and were held every Tuesday from 2:30–4:00 PM, led by Rev. Eric Tay and Sis. Yee Ling. As the environment is a secular setting, direct gospel sharing is limited. The ministry therefore sought to demonstrate Christ's love through consistent service and relational engagement, and requested prayer for wisdom and creativity to witness through word and deed.

3. Seeker Bible Studies in Residents' Homes (October–November)

A meaningful spiritual breakthrough occurred beginning in October 2025 with the start of seeker Bible studies held in residents' homes. Five residents expressed interest in learning more about the Christian faith and participated in weekly sessions. Because of differing schedules, sessions were conducted separately on weekdays and weekends.

These gatherings were intentionally simple, personal, and relational. We begin with prayer, followed by Bible reading, sharing, and singing, concluding with benediction, and continuing with light refreshments and fellowship. Though modest in number, this step represents deepened spiritual engagement, with prayerful hope that participants will come to understand the message of salvation, experience God's love, and in God's time, follow Christ and be baptised into His church.

THANKSGIVING AND CONCLUSION

The year 2025 was marked by God's faithfulness and guidance as Blk 123 Ministry strengthened relationships in the community, expanded ministry access through AWWA Community Home, engaged residents through practical community outreach, and began seeker Bible studies in homes.

The ministry gives thanks for every open door and every opportunity to sow the Word of God and serve the community in Christ's name. As we look ahead, we continue to trust the Lord to bring fruit in His time and to strengthen His church for faithful witness and compassionate service. To God alone be all glory.

PRAYER POINTS

- » For unity and faithfulness among all co-workers serving in the ministry team.
- » For wisdom, discernment, and compassion in conversations, visits, and planning.
- » For more regular volunteers and sufficient resources to sustain weekly work at AWWA Community Home.
- » For open hearts among residents and staff, and for lasting relationships that support gospel witness.
- » For residents attending seeker Bible studies: steady attendance, spiritual growth, and saving faith in Christ.
- » For God's timing and provision, including the removal of scheduling obstacles and other constraints.
